- WHEREAS: The particular attention and critical analysis of one member of this City Council served as a catalyst to the City administration, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the developer to move expeditiously on this project; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council, in recognition of his love for children, sports and all recreational activity, and as official acknowledgment of his continuous monitoring of this long and complex development, go on record naming the New Street Park as the Thomas W. Danahy Park; and be it further
