- WHEREAS: Fred served for thirty one years as a Deputy Sheriff of Middlesex County serving in various capacities including that of chauffeur for the late long-time sheriff Howard W. Fitzpatrick and rose through the ranks to become Chief of Transportation, the position from which he retired; and
- WHEREAS: Fred was known to his many friends and associates for his attention to detail, particularly his ability to remember names and faces, as well as always making himself available to provide assistance to someone in need; now, therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Frances Pierce and to the entire Pierce family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
