(which were luckily retrieved)

jeweler at Inman Square,
Cambridge, saw the remains,
and told me that the
only thing that could be
done, would to be put the

diamonds in new settings.
(the originals being entirely
broken and pulled apart;
where the stones were first
set. The price was \$1235.00.

My husband went to

manager of Cambridge Hos-
pital, and he readily agreed
that the rings were
a "shambles"

without becoming very upset.
