This will serve as official notice to place the question outlined in the order adopted by the City Council on April 27, 1981 on the coming municipal ballot in November.

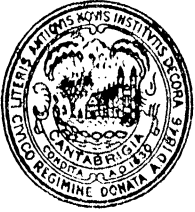

That in accordance with Chapter 53, Section 18A of the Massachusetts General Laws which provides that on the petition of ten registered voters a non-binding public opinion advisory question can be placed on the November 3, 1981 ballot for the city election, therefore be it

ORDERED:

That the following question shall be placed on the official ballot for November 3, 1981.

"Shall the Cambridge City Council call upon our Representative in Congress to oppose sending U.S. troops, military advisers, arms, or military aid of any sort whatsoever to the governments of El Salvador, Honduras and Guatemala?"

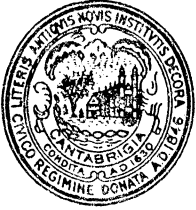
