It becomes my sad duty to notify you of the death of Thomas C. Kennedy on April 12, 1930. Mr. Kennedy had been ill for a short time only, and his death came somewhat unexpected. He was a member of the Board of Aldermen during the year 1915, and at the time of his death he was a member of the Water Board, on which Board he had served since 1926.

I recommend that suitable action be taken by your Honorable Board as a mark of respect to his memory, in which action I shall be glad to join.

A communication has been received from His Honor the Mayor notifying the City Council of the death of Thomas E. Kennedy on April 12th inst. it is fitting and proper that suitable action be taken as a mark of respect to his memory, it is

RESOLVED:-

That, in the death of Thomas E. Kennedy, the city has lost a public spirited citizen. He was born in this city 63 years ago and lived his entire life among us. In 1915 he was elected to the Board of Alderman for the term of one year but owing to the change of government he served but nine months of the term. In 1926 he was appointed a member of the Water Board for the term of five years which was cut short by his untimely death.

He was a vigorous and active public official with a likeable personality which endeared to him a legion of friends who will deeply mourn his death.

The City Council hereby attests its appreciation of his faithful adherence to the public service and regrets his being called to his last reward while still possessed of a rugged constitution and a will to carry on. And it is further
