June 25, 1984

- WHEREAS: August 6th is the 39th Anniversary of the dropping of the atomic bomb on Hiroshima; and
- WHEREAS: The survivors of Hiroshima and Nagaskai, which was bombed on August 9, are living monuments to the horror of Nuclear War; and
- WHEREAS: The threat of nuclear war has increased many-fold in the years since 1945; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council declare August 6th as Hiroshima Day - a day of remembrance and a day to rededicate our efforts toward peace and a non-nuclear world; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That Hiroshima Day be declared annually and further that the Cambridge Peace Commission and City Council make note of the event in a suitable manner to alert the citizenry of Cambridge to the history of Hiroshima and Nagasaki and the rededication of our city toward peace.
