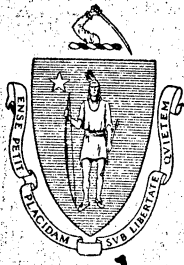

IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY- FOUR

## AN ACT Authorizing the re-instatement of Joseph P. Murphy to his former position of patrolman in the Police Department of the City of Cambridge

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the Director of Civil Service upon request of the appointing authority of the City of Cambridge shall re-instate Joseph P. Murphy to the position of patrolman in the Police Department of said city, a position formerly held by Joseph P. Murphy, provided the said appointing authority submits to the Director of Civil Service in writing the reasons why such re-instatement would be in the public interest.

SECTION 2. No seniority rights, probationary period, preference rights, retirement rights, nor any other rights of employment shall attach to the re-instatement to said position for the former service in said position.

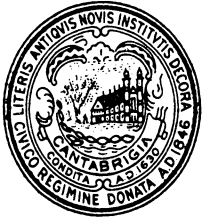
