WHEREAS: Reports have it that the Salvation Army Store on Memorial Drive which is owned by the Stop and Shop Corp. is being evicted; and

WHEREAS: This store serves people of modest means who depend upon it for clothing and other articles for their homes; and

WHEREAS: This would increase the hardship on those who are already suffering due to the lack of a supermarket in the area; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record as being opposed to the closing of this Salvation Army Store and send a copy of this resolution to the Stop and Shop with the hope that they might re-consider their decision provided that if it will be a food store, the Council will not oppose the decision so long as the Community Development Department helps the Salvation Army relocate.
