

Cambridge, Oct. 8, 1892

To the Honorable, the City Council,
of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned respectfully pray represents that, in compliance with the order of the City Council, she removed her building from the ground of her lease taken for the extension of Portman Street - that the award originally made her was, as she believes, inadequate but she did not intend to ask for any further sum. But she represents that after being on the expense of removing said building, whether from unforeseen defects in the ground to which it was removed, or some other cause beyond her control, it fell to the ground causing a loss to her of at least \$1,000. Wherefore she prays that you transcendental would consider all the circumstances and make her such further award as may seem just and proper.
