The undersigned, owner of more than twenty per cent of the area of land proposed to be included in the change to the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Cambridge as contemplated by the captioned petition, hereby protests against such change pursuant to G.L. c. 40A Section 5 as added by Chapter 808 of the Acts of 1975, for the reasons that the proposed change would constitute spot zoning and a taking of property without compensation and that such change would impermissibly restrict the use of land for proper educational purposes in violation of the so-called Dover Amendment, as contained in G.L. c. 40A Section 3 as added by said Chapter 808.
