business for the conduct of all of its business.

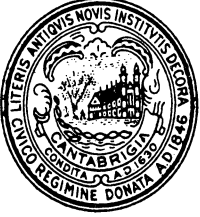
All of the property described by the current addresses, which are known from

designed to enhance the beauty and prominence of Fort Washington.

We request the change of address to unify and clarify the address designation
for the property. We also request use of the Fort Washington designation because
it will lend to the ready identification of the location. Furthermore, we believe
that the use of that address will serve to recognize and publicize the existence of
this historic landmark.
