- WHEREAS: The people of Cambridge hold our elder citizens in high regard, and share a concern for their comfort, safety, and quality of life, and
- WHEREAS: Many of Cambridge's elder citizens live in housing owned and managed by the Cambridge Housing Authority; and
- WHEREAS: There is a significant amount of common space, such as day-rooms, in this type of housing, some of which is lacking in air-conditioning, comfort, and attractiveness; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council request the City Manager to determine residents desires for brightening up the common space, through the use of plants and wall art, and review the condition of furnishings, as well as the availability of air-conditioned day rooms in CHA senior citizen housing; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager determine ways the City can work in conjunction with the Cambridge Housing Authority to address these needs.

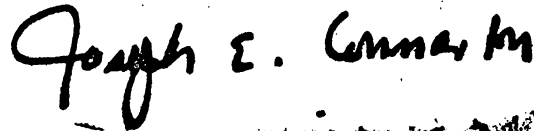
