Suspicion of brutal behavior on the part of any police hits at the very heart of a system of laws and makes the job of the law-abiding policeman impossible, now therefore be it

ORDERED:-

That it is the policy of the City Council that the Chief of Police consider all charges of police brutality as extremely grave; within twelve hours to relieve from duty, pending a full investigation, any officer of whom there is reason to believe has been engaged in police brutality; and to exact the maximum penalty allowable from any officer against whom such charges are substantiated in a full and proper hearing.

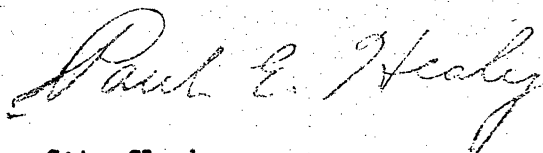

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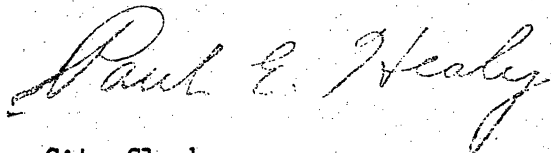
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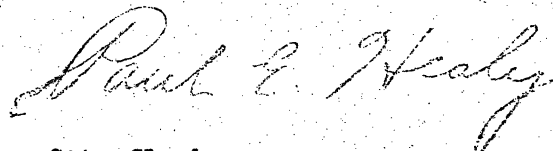
