WHEREAS: We, the Cambridge City Council, believe in the immediate restoration of human rights and the democratic process in Haiti; and

WHEREAS: We believe that the safe return of President Aristide to power in that country is necessary to the process and that the presence of informed witnesses will help it take place; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council supports the New England Observer's Delegation to Haiti to help bring about the immediate resignation of the coup regime and to support and protect the legitimate, elected government of President Aristide and his cabinet, and all the Haitian people; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council supports the Cambridge participation in the delegation including delegation leader, Dessima Williams, a former Ambassador of Granada and member of the Cambridge Peace Commission, Cathy Hoffman, Cambridge Peace Commission Director, and resident Carol Thomas who are in Haiti from Friday, October 29, 1993 through Monday, November 1, 1993; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council is on notice for the safety of its delegates from this city, for the safety of the Haitian people and for their elected representatives including President Aristide; and be it further

RESOLVED: That through the delegation's witness, the Cambridge City Council adds its eyes and support for the restoration of democracy to Haiti.
