IN CITY COUNCIL

April 9, 1979

WHEREAS:

Manuel G. Mello, a former employee of the Police Department of the City of Cambridge, entered the service of the Police Department on October 2, 1908 and was pensioned on July 10, 1949 under the provisions of Chapter 32 Section 83A Sub-division 3 and died on January 31, 1979, having served not less than forty years, and

WHEREAS:

At the time of his death said employee had no right to elect that benefits be paid to his survivor, said employee leaves as his survivor, his widow, Mrs. Mary J. Mello, who has not remarried and is not receiving any retirement allowance or pension under the provisions of any general or special law, therefore be it

ORDERED:

That, under the provisions of Chapter 32, Section 95A of the General Laws, Tercentenary Edition and amendments thereto, that in order to promote the public good, and in consideration of the long and meritorious service performed by Manuel G. Mello, an annuity be granted to Mrs. Mary J. Mello, of \$3,000.00 per year as long as she does not remarry.

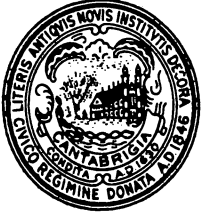


