This amount is necessary at this time in order that we may be able to pay for parts for police vehicles.

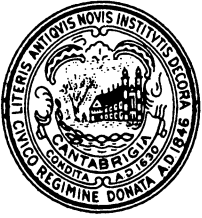
There is only enough money in this account at the present time to purchase parts for one month.


