WHEREAS: "Buzzy" as he was known by everyone who had the opportunity to meet him was born in Cohasset, served as a staff sergeant in the Army Air Corps during World War II and upon being honorably discharged, joined the Metropolitan Police force in 1951, being promoted to the rank of detective in 1965; spending a number of years with the district attorney's office of Suffolk County, working for a while as an undercover narcotics investigator; and

WHEREAS: Detective White held a series of patrol assignments at both the Upper Basin and the Lower Basin districts throughout his long and distinguished career during which he established himself as a professional law enforcement officer as well as a friend to hundreds of people; now therefore be it

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John P. White, 72

Was Metropolitan Police officer

John P. White, a detective with the Metropolitan Police for 20 years until his retirement in 1985, died of a heart attack Saturday at Massachusetts General Hospital. He was 72 and lived in Cambridge.

Born in Cohasset, he served as a staff sergeant in the Army Air Corps during World War II. He joined the metropolitan force as an officer in 1951.

After assignments at the Upper Basin and Lower Basin districts, Mr. White, known as Buzzy, was promoted to detective in 1965 and spent a number of years with the Suffolk County district attorney's office, in part as an undercover narcotics investigator.

Mr. White was a charter member of the Metropolitan Police Union, local 55 of the Teamsters.

He leaves two sisters, Mary Welch and Margaret T. Robinson of Cambridge; and a brother, William of Arlington.

A funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. today in Sacred Heart Church, East Cambridge. Burial will be in Mount Auburn Cemetery.
