WHEREAS: On June 30, 1980, the Massachusetts Bay Transit Authority was engaged in constructing an extension to the Red Line Subway System into the Alewife Area at a cost of \$800 million, and as considerable portions of that construction activity was located in residential areas of North Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: The MBTA Red Line extension project was causing severe disruptions and having a negative impact on the stability of the North Cambridge and Cambridge Highlands residential neighborhoods, while creating a new transit system at Alewife which made the 360-70 acre Alewife industrial area more attractive to new development due to increased accessibility; and

WHEREAS: That the City Council adopt an Alewife Development Area Stabilization Program to include the North Cambridge and Cambridge Highland residential neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS: That the City Manager put the Stabilization Program into effect starting in Fiscal Year 1981; now as of Fiscal Year 1991; and

WHEREAS: There is a current need for the City to develop a new master plan for the Alewife area, with adequate input from the impacted residential neighborhoods and the concerned business community, to guide future development in the area; and

WHEREAS: Any new development in the area can still be expected to cause further neighborhood disruption and have a continued negative impact on the stability of North Cambridge and the surrounding neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS: The North Cambridge Stabilization Committee has been in effect and very active in North Cambridge for many years; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City adopt an Alewife Steering Committee which will consist of six residents from the surrounding neighborhoods of 9, 10, 11 and 12 (with one resident being elected or appointed to the Steering Committee by the North Cambridge Stabilization Committee and one additional citizen at large to serve as Chair); five business and land owners and be the principal forum for eliciting input from the residential and business communities; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to put the said committee into effect starting immediately; and be it further
