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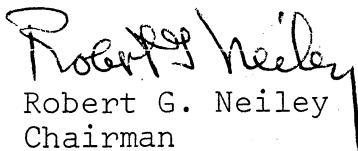

CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATENESS Case 48

The Cambridge Historical Commission hereby certifies, pursuant to the Massachusetts Historic Districts Act and the Cambridge Historical Commission Ordinance, upon application of R. B. Gates, Superintendent of Facilities, Harvard Law School, with respect to Hastings Hall, 1533-1541 Massachusetts Avenue, in the Cambridge Common Historic District, that the following will be appropriate:

removal of existing screens; installation of combination aluminum storm windows with screens on double-hung sash windows and of storm panels on fire escape windows of the casement type; all aluminum to be painted black as per sample submitted; storm windows to be fastened to each window box so that molded side and head casings will show beyond storm sash at sides and top of window; existings steel grills on basement and first floor windows to remain in place.
