

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, June 10. 1862.

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessarily require that a private street, called Roseland Street, running from North Avenue to Beacon Street, in Somerville, through land of Ogden's heirs, be laid out as a public highway from said North Avenue as far as the Somerville line:-

Therefore Ordered, That said street be and the same is hereby laid out and established as a public highway, by the name of Roseland Street, by metes and bounds as follows:-

Beginning in the Easterly line of North Avenue, at the distance of seventy-five feet Northerly from the land of Frost, thence running in a straight line in a direction a little South of East, five hundred and ninety-six and four-tenths feet to the Somerville line: Said street to be forty feet in width, through its whole extent, and to lie wholly on the Northerly side of the before described line, said line being parallel with the Northerly line of said Frost's land:- the said Street being delineated on a plan drawn by Charles F. Barbier, dated May, 1861, and now before this Board.

And whereas it is adjudged that no damages

is sustained by said horse, by reason of the
laying out of said street.

Ordered, That no damages be allowed there.
