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Dear City Councillors,

You are invited to join other leaders in Cambridge for a Save the Harbor/Save the Bay Sewer Tour. Our "Sewer Tours" bring together decision makers and activists from each of the 43 communities which dump their sewage into Boston Harbor to give them a close look at what happens at the other end of the pipe. We are pulling together a trip for the City of Cambridge now, and invite you to find a date on the enclosed calendar which is good for you.

If the problem of the Harbor cleanup and the future of sewage treatment in the Boston area is a little too abstract to mean much to you, our tour should give you a more solid grip on the issue. If you're already familiar with the Harbor and its abuse, our tour should add to your knowledge while giving you an opportunity to meet other people in your community with whom you may wish to discuss the problem. Either way you'll get to see the best view of downtown Boston that exists.

We will meet in the **Charlestown Navy Yard, and after** a brief classroom presentation, we will leave from Pier 6 in our 25 foot Boston Whaler to view the worst site of toxic pollution in the Harbor, the Deer Island Treatment Plant and a classic example of a combined sewer overflow pipe, a major source of pollution for the Boston Harbor.

The trip scheduled for Cambridge is an important step in involving all of us in the cleanup effort of one of our most valuable resources.
