- WHEREAS:** We are currently being prevailed upon to act responsibly toward energy consumption and to conserve our irreplaceable fossil fuels; and
- WHEREAS:** Modern society has placed great dependence on the automobile, often needlessly, creating tremendous traffic and parking problems in addition to almost unbearable congestion in our urban centers; and
- WHEREAS:** One real solution to our nation's transportation and energy dilemma is greater reliance and emphasis on inexpensive, convenient and comprehensive public transportation; and
- WHEREAS:** The Boston Metropolitan region is fortunate indeed to have the MBTA, a convenient, inexpensive, modern and constantly improving public transportation system serving 79 communities; and
- WHEREAS:** This practical alternative is made even more desirable through the MBTA Pass Program; and
- WHEREAS:** The T Pass Program offers six plans designed to meet your transportation needs while saving you money, time and energy; and
- WHEREAS:** This program is made more convenient through payroll deduction; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do declare April 24 - 30 as " MBTA Pass Program Week", and urge all Cambridge municipal employees to do their part in resolving our energy and transportation crisis by enrolling in the T Pass Program.
