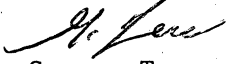

Dear Mr. Moskow:

I have received answers from all the abutters of Winthrop Street concerning parking for the abutters. The following three parties have shown interest in parking spaces. Mr. Robert Janes, Mr. Raymond Moskow and the O'Brien Family Partnership.

As of today, only yourself and Mr. Janes have definitely stated that they would like to utilize this street for private parking therefore, I will allow you to proceed with the necessary arrangements for parking on the northeast side of Winthrop Street from John F. Kennedy Street to Dunster Street. The following procedures should be followed:

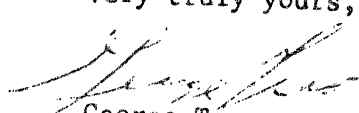
1. Signing: Three signs should be posted on this street one(1) 20 feet from John F. Kennedy St.; one(1) 20 feet from Dunster Street and the other somewhere in the middle of the block. These signs shall have the following legend. "No Trespassing By Parking-Violators will be Towed At Their Own Expense".
2. Notification: The tow company that is selected to tow from this section of Winthrop St. shall notify the police department in writing of this fact along with the written approval of the abutters. The tow company shall notify the police department of every vehicle towed from this street and comply with the rules setup by the police department.
3. Maintenance: It shall be the responsibility of the abutters utilizing this parking to insure that the street and sidewalk is cleaned of all debris, snow and that all pot holes are filled to insure the safety of pedestrians.

4. Fire Clearance: The Police and Traffic Departments will tag and tow any vehicle that parks within 20 feet of the intersections and any vehicle that parks on the southeast side. The Traffic Department will post these signs.
5. Number of Spaces: There are ten (10) spaces available in this area and I suggest that you and Mr. Janes get together to determine how to allocate these spaces and also how to identify legal parkers.

Again, I must repeat that these rules and regulations are governed by state statute and must be obeyed. My staff will be available to assist you in any way we can.

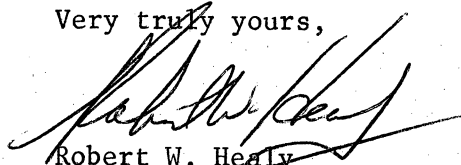
