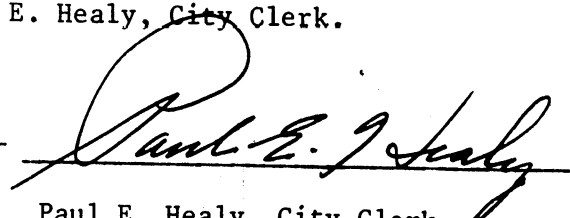
MAYOR RUSSELL

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Thomas J. Dooley of Jamaica Plain, Co-founder and former President and Treasurer of Dooley Brothers, Inc., a waste collection and disposal company in Brighton; and
- WHEREAS: Dooley Brothers, the oldest solid waste collection and disposal firm in the country was originally established by Mr. Dooley's grandfather in 1856 and was incorporated in 1928; and
- WHEREAS: Dooley Brothers merged with Browning Ferris Industries in 1971 under Thomas Dooley's leadership and he remained in a management position with BFI until illness forced him to retire; and
- WHEREAS: Thomas J. Dooley was an active horse race competitor, owning several horses, and in 1974 winning the Grand National Amateur Park Harness Class in Detroit, with his horse named Royal Fleetson, a world champion Morgan stallion; and
- WHEREAS: Thomas was a life member of the Ancient and Honorable Artillery and was awarded the 1981 Man of the Year Award from the organization for his many civic and charitable accomplishments; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Mary Dooley and to the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
