WHEREAS

Notice has been received from His Honor, the Mayor, of the death of Dr. David Bolger on June 7, 1939, it is fitting and proper that recognition should be given this sad event.

Dr. Bolger was born in Cambridge and resided here during his entire lifetime, seventy-one years. A graduate of the Cambridge High and Latin School he then attended the McGill University in Montreal later taking special courses at Harvard University in his chosen profession, that of Veterinary.

A great lover of all animals Dr. Bolger recognized the need of solicitude for their welfare and he could not refuse their mute appeal. He had a wide and varied experience in the supervision and treatment of animal diseases and was recognized as an authority in this field.

His record of service to Cambridge as City Veterinary for a period of over twenty-five years is one indeed of which to be proud. It is therefore

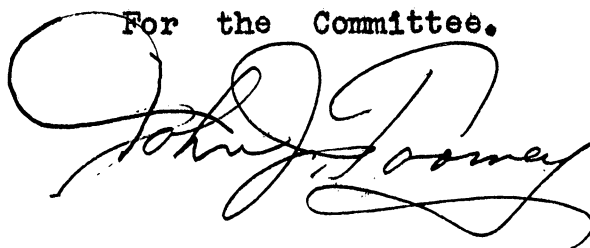
