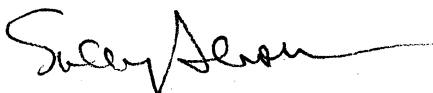
On behalf of the Harvard Square Business Association and the City of Cambridge, I would like to request permission of the City Council and the City Manager to hold our annual Holiday Light Procession through Harvard Square on Friday, November 23, 1990 (the day after Thanksgiving) beginning in Quincy Sq. -- corner of Mass. Avenue and Quincy Street -- at 5:00 p.m.

Traditionally, our procession has included city officials, a fire truck, clowns, puppets, the Boston Ballet, an Old Town Trolley, and carolers who have marched toward Charles Square for the festivities and the City's official tree-lighting ceremony in the courtyard. The Charles Hotel has hosted a party for dignitaries overlooking the courtyard that evening, and I believe they plan to do so again.

The procession only needs to block traffic for a short period while we turn the corner near Out of Town News. For this short time, we will need a cruiser leading the procession and a little help from duty officers and/or the police auxilliary forces at Church Street and at the intersections along the way. We look forward to another delightful procession en route to the gala opening of the 1990 holiday season in Cambridge, and we would appreciate any help or suggestions you may have in this regard.
