RESOLVED: That this City Council does hereby declare the week of May 1st through May 7th to be BOOK WEEK in the City of Cambridge, to coincide with the 1995 Harvard Square Book Festival, and encourages all parents, students, residents - and anyone who's ever been transported, moved, entertained, or inspired by a book - to seize upon this opportunity to celebrate the written word, and to promote literacy throughout the City; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this City Council does hereby offer its congratulations and thanks to the Booksellers of Harvard Square, for their significant efforts to promote literacy and an awareness of our literary heritage in the City of Cambridge.
