In Board of Aldermen, Nov. 25<sup>th</sup> 1864

The Joint Standing Com. on Ordinances to which was referred the order of the City Council in relation to the election of certain City Officers have duly considered the same and would respectfully Report that the Amendment of the City Charter passed April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1864 ~~seems to~~ designates the time when officers elected by the City Council shall be chosen - as follows.

Sec. 4 - "In addition to the election of officers in the month of January, provided for in the Act in Addition to an Act to establish the City of Cambridge, approved April 14<sup>th</sup> 1859 the City Council shall, in the month of January, annually, in convention and by joint ballot, elect all subordinate officers who are not chosen by the inhabitants, or appointed by the Mayor, Aldermen -"

In view of the foregoing provision of the City Charter your Committee would

respectfully recommend that no further  
legislation be adopted.
