As Cambridge residents, we, the undersigned, protest the recently announced policy of Harvard Real Estate, Inc., to sell off large numbers of its rent-controlled properties on a priority basis to Senior Harvard faculty, thereby decontrolling those apartments. This policy will significantly reduce the availability of affordable apartments for low and moderate income people living in Cambridge. It will displace a large number of tenants and absorb parts of the Agassiz and Riverside neighborhoods into the Harvard campus, putting additional strain on the Cambridge housing situation.
