To the Mayor & Aldermen of
the City of Cambridge.
Gentlemen,

We, the undersigned, residing in & near Everett Street, respectfully ask that crossing-stones may be placed from the end of Everett Street to the track of the horse-railroad on the North Avenue, & that these stones may be raised a little above the level of the road. At present it is often too wet at this point for passengers to reach the cars comfortably - sometimes from rain or thaw, & sometimes from the copious sprinkling of the water-carts. Another advantage in this improvement would be that it would complete a neat

crossing of the North Avenue
from Everett Street to Channing
Street, there being stones laid
already from the latter street
to the railroad-track.
