In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred  
and Seventy Three.

An Ordinance in relation to Bow-windows  
and other projections from buildings.

As it ordained by the City Council of the  
City of Cambridge, as follows.

No person shall construct or place or cause  
to be constructed or placed, any portico, bal-  
cony, balustrade, porch, door, window or  
step, which shall project into any street, under  
a penalty of not less than five nor more  
than twenty dollars for each offence, and a  
like penalty for every day that the said portico,  
balcony, balustrade, porch, door, window  
or step shall be continued, as aforesaid,  
after notice to remove the same from the  
Board of Mayor and Aldermen or some  
person by them authorized.
