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To His Honor the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the
City of Cambridge

Gentlemen,

The undersigned citizens
and taxpayers in Cambridge, respectfully request that the
town lines of the following streets in Ward Five, now fixed
to wit, Green Street, Franklin, William, Lotting and Auburn
streets. No line having been established to our knowledge in
the above named streets, there are continual controversy
and difficulties arising among property holders on
the same, some complaining that they do not have their
due quantities of land, and many we believe have more
than they are entitled to. Your petitioners, therefore ask
your honourable board, that accurate surveys and
plans may be made by the City Engineer, of said streets,
and that said plans may be placed among the re-
cords of the City for future reference.
