WHEREAS: Attention has been called to the fact that Continental Cablevision's policy about refunding money for remote control units upon their return to the company differs from city to city and town to town; and

WHEREAS: For example in Weston a subscriber is free to buy a remote control unit and save 2.95 per month when the rented one is returned. In Cambridge a subscriber may do likewise but must still pay \$2.00 per month. Apparently the reason cited to one Cambridge subscriber was, "it's for the box". While the cable company is the same in both communities, there appears to be no uniform policy as a result of which cable subscribers in Cambridge are taking an unfair hit; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the issue be referred the Council Cable TV Communications Committee as an agenda item for its next public hearing; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to transmit a certified copy of this Order to the General Manager of Continental Cablevision, Mr. Philip Ripa, together with a cover letter requesting clarification of the referenced policy in preparation for a Public Hearing which will be scheduled within a few weeks.
