

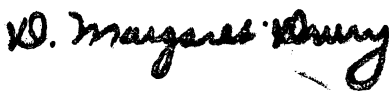

WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council has gone on record in favor of nuclear disarmament; and

WHEREAS: Mayor Michael Sullivan has joined the International Mayors for Peace as a signatory to the call for an end to nuclear weapons and destruction; and

WHEREAS: Mayor Tadatoshi Akiba is President of the World Conference of Mayors for Peace through Inter-City Solidarity and the organization which it has created known as Mayors for Peace; and

WHEREAS: The Purposes of the "Mayors for Peace" are to contribute to the attainment of lasting world peace by arousing concern among citizens of the world for the total abolition of nuclear weapons through close solidarity among all cities which agree to the "Program to Promote Solidarity of Cities towards the Total Abolition of Nuclear Weapons" as well as by striving to solve vital problems for the human race such as starvation and poverty, the plight of refugees, human rights abuses, and environmental degradation; and

WHEREAS: Mayor Tadatoshi Akiba has a long history with Cambridge and the Boston area as graduate student at MIT and professor at Tufts University before returning to Hiroshima to serve as an elected official; and

WHEREAS: Mayor Tadatoshi Akiba is honoring the city of Cambridge by keynoting a program entitled FROM HIROSHIMA TO WASHINGTON DC - THE CASE FOR DISARMAMENT, Tuesday, October 15, 7-9 PM at MIT; and
