WHEREAS: The Planning Board is considering the question of whether to approve a development to be placed between Concord Avenue and Garden Street just north of Arsenal Square; and

WHEREAS: The development requires automobile access to the property, with curb cuts to the street; and

WHEREAS: The intersection of Garden Street and Concord Avenue at Arsenal Square is already a complex one with automobiles often backed up and difficult pedestrian access; and

WHEREAS: The automobile entrance and exits on Concord Avenue and Garden streets from the new development so near Arsenal Square could add substantial difficulty and danger; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to have the Traffic and Parking Department do a traffic study of the entire Arsenal Square area, including whether a permanent traffic light is needed, and, in the context of the entire area, to determine what the best configuration of automobile access in and out of the new development should be; and be it further

ORDERED: That this study precede the issuance of any permissions for the development and be made public and sent to the City Council.
