An Ordinance to establish a city Seal

Be it ordained by the City Council of the
City of Cambridge as follows -

That a view, in distant perspective -
of the City of Cambridge and the City of
Boston, united by a bridge, and having on
the extreme right the towers of Gore Hall
and on the extreme left the dome of the
State House, shall be the devise of the City
Seal. -; the motto, round the device, shall
be as follows. to wit. "Litteris antiquis, novis
institutiis, decora" and the inscription shall be
as follows. to wit - "Cambridge, condita A. D.
1630. civico regimine donata, ^{A. D.} 1846"
