Dear Sir:

Replying to your inquiry of the 1st inst. we have to say that all of the land bordering on the southerly side of the Massachusetts Central Division of the Boston & Maine Railroad, beginning at a point 120 feet ^{we} east of Clifton Street and running to land of Metropolitan Park system is owned by the City of Cambridge, except a parcel beginning at a point about 520 feet from the original starting point with a frontage of about 149 feet on said railroad and containing 20,275 square feet which is owned by the Boston & Maine Railroad.

The area of the entire holdings of the City of Cambridge at this point and running to Rindge Ave. is 872014^{sq. ft.}, with an average valuation, on the records of this office, of five cents per square foot. The assessed value of the lot owned by the Boston & Maine Railroad is ten cents per square foot. If that portion of the city's land now occupied by the Dix Lumber Co. were to be assessed separately by this department it would be valued at ten cents per square foot.
