WHEREAS: A recent disturbance involving gunfire at the corner of Forest Street and Oxford Street has alarmed many residents of this quiet residential neighborhood who expressed their frustrations at a neighborhood meeting on Thursday evening at the Agassiz Community Center which was also attended by representatives of the Cambridge Police Department; and

WHEREAS: This incident capped an escalating series of disturbances in the neighborhood, including a street assault in which a female resident was robbed; and

WHEREAS: While the Police Department representatives stated that they are working to see that those who appear to be responsible for these incidents are evicted or are arrested, they suggested that immediate steps might be taken to insure that the area is as well lit as possible; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to have the Public Works Department assess the adequacy of the lighting at the corner of Forest Street and Oxford Street and immediately correct any deficiencies, replace any malfunctioning lamps, and trim the trees as necessary to allow for maximum illumination of existing fixtures.
