Be it ordained by the City Council of the
City of Cambridge, as follows:-

~~That~~ No person shall suffer his wagon,
cart, sled or other vehicle, to remain ^{an} unnecessary
^{length of time} ~~any~~ ~~on~~ any sidewalk, or in any street,
lane, or alley of the City ~~for a~~ ~~long~~ ~~or~~ ~~an~~ ~~unreasonable~~ ~~length~~ ~~of~~ ~~time~~ ~~in~~ ~~the~~ ~~day~~ ~~time~~; and any person violating this
ordinance shall forfeit and pay a sum
not exceeding twenty dollars.
