Dear Councillors;

The Ward 5 Democratic Committee held a public forum on the proposed residential downzoning for Cambridgeport on Thursday, October 16th. Approximately sixty residents attended. There was an informational presentation. Strong views were expressed, both pro and con. There was no consensus reached by the end of the meeting, nor was there a clear majority viewpoint. In fact, there was some confusion and a call for more accurate data from the Community Development Department.

Many people spoke saying that the most important issue of affordability of new and renovated housing was not addressed by this petition.

On Tuesday, November 11th, the Ward 5 Democratic Committee met and voted to recommend that a new zoning petition be drafted that addresses the affordability to persons of low and moderate incomes. We have appointed a subcommittee to study the matter and make recommendations to the whole ward committee. We would be happy to coordinate and cooperate with your committee in this quest.

Hoping that you will take this position into consideration in your deliberations. Thank you.
