City Hall, Nov. 6th 1871 -

"The committee on Park in Ward 5, beg leave to report.

Having carefully considered the propriety and desirability of purchasing land in Ward 5, for a Public Park - and having confd with different parties owning lands suited to such purpose - also having obtained the refusal of price on such lands, would recommend the purchase of the section of land bounded as follows -

Beginning at or near the large willow tree, standing near the Fitchburg Rail Road, on land owned by Judge John S. Land, above and near Porter's Station, and running on the line of said road to Stalden Street - thence on line of Stalden Street, to a new street recently opened by the New England Brick Co, called Mt. Pleasant St. - thence on the line, said Mt. Pleasant St., to the proposed line of the new street known as Lambert Avenue - thence turning and going down the line of said Avenue on land owned by the said Brick Co, and land of Whitney Estate, to the junction of a new street, coming down to connect with said Avenue, from Mt. Vernon St., near residence of George A. Sawyer Esq - thence turning at nearly a right angle across land belonging to said Whitney Est. and land of Judge Land, to the place of beginning - The lands herein embraced, belong to the New England Brick Co, Oliver Bennett,

Whitney Bros. and John S. Ladd containing about twelve
(12) acres, or the same more or less, and the whole purchase
to cost a sum not exceeding One Hundred Thousands doll.
(\$100,000) — The committee taking into consideration
the near expiration of this municipal year, would now
the reference of the matter to the early attention of the next
city government, with the recommendation that a city
debt be created, or an appropriation be made for the
purchase of the same. —
