The investigation of the explosion at the above address is still ongoing. Although it has been determined that it was a short circuit, the exact cause of that "short" has not been pinpointed. It appears that a switch gear was involved. The Cambridge Electric Light Company is consulting with the manufacturer of the equipment, private consultants, and others, in this matter. The City's wiring inspector, Michael Nicoloro, has also been involved in this investigation.

It is obvious that necessary precautions to prevent a recurrence of this will not be thoroughly detailed until the exact cause has been determined.

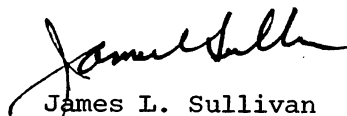
