ORDERED:

That in accordance with Chapter 34 of the General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized to grant a permit to Ann Marie Capuzzi acting on behalf of the Movement Book Cooperative for the purpose of holding a rummage sale at the fence line at the intersection of Garden and Mass. Ave. on the following date of May 12, 1973 between the hours of 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P. M.

Provided that no such permit shall be granted for the encroachment of said merchandise upon the sidewalk to exceed more than twenty-five per cent of the width of the sidewalk from the property line of the premises in front of which said display shall be installed and provided further the Commissioner of Public Works shall prescribe any other conditions that he deems necessary to carry out the intent of this order.

Dear Mr. Healy:

This letter is to request a permit to hold a rummage sale on the Cambridge Common sidewalk on a Saturday in the month of April. We would prefer that the exact date be Saturday, April 28, 1973, but if the area is already in use on that day, we would choose an alternative of May 5th, 1973.

As you suggested when I spoke with you on the phone on Thursday, we would like to use the area on Garden Street, against the fence by the sidewalk. The hours would be from 9 a.m to 5 p.m.

Our group is the Movement Book Cooperative, a non-profit service organization and we would use the money to buy literature of an educational nature. We also sponsor book exchanges that are open to the community to use.

It is ofcourse understood that we will not leave any litter of any type and that we will not be of any nuisance or trouble to those who wish to use the area after us.

I appreciated speaking with you about this on the phone and I have every hope that the space will be open on one of those Saturdays.
