After viewing the area of Lake View Avenue relative to the unloading of cars by the Porter Square Chevrolet Company, Inc.: I find that the company is loading and unloading in front of their property which is legal.

I have discussed this matter with the Chief of Police and Mrs. Mary Cignetti who made the complaint and we all agree that they could load and unload in front of their property, but not during the nighttime.

Mrs. Cignetti also complained about the number of U-haul trucks that are left overnight on the street. We do have a traffic rule governing the overnight parking by commercial vehicles and I will notify Porter Square Chevrolet of this law, as well as the police department.


