After having had some experience in the care and repair of the Public Property they are of a unanimous opinion that a Superintendent should be appointed under the direction of the City authorities to ~~take~~ charge of all the Public Buildings fences trees scales &c at a reasonable compensation Your Committee believe that it would be a great saving. It is often the case when one of the Committee might purchase an article when there is one already stored away, which if known might have saved the expense of purchasing a new one. Then the Committee of the Fish Department they will purchase articles for their Department when the same might have been found stored away not in use owing to various changes that are continually going on, and when so many have the liberty to purchase for the City it is not to be expected that they will do it so well as one who will spend his whole time and know where all the property is,

City of Cambridge

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-four.  
An Ordinance providing for the Appointments,  
and prescribing the duties of a Superintendent  
of Public Property.

Be it ordained by the City Council of  
the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Art. 1. - There shall be chosen annually a  
Superintendent of Public Property in the manner  
now provided for the election of a Superintendent  
of Streets and Drains, who shall be subject to  
removal, and whose compensation shall be  
fixed, by the City Council.

Art. 2. Before entering upon the duties of his  
office, he shall give bond to the City with sureties  
to the satisfaction of the Mayor and Aldermen,  
in the sum of two thousand dollars, with  
condition, that he will not directly or indirectly,  
be interested in any contract or agreement for  
labor or materials furnished the City in the  
department of which he is Superintendent.

Act 3. Hedshall, under the direction of the Joint Standing Committee on Public Property, have the care and custody of all buildings, fences, trees, and scales belonging to the city, make all contracts for the supply of labor or materials necessary for the repair of the same; superintend all such repairs, perform such other services as may be required of him in relation to the same by the City Council, and annually in the month of December make a report thereof and of the condition of the same to said Council.
