Ordered, That due notice be given to the owners and abutters on the line of said extension and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to extend said street by taking a portion of said private land and laying out the same as a public street; and that WEDNESDAY, the eleventh day of May next, at 8 o'clock, P. M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections that may be made thereto.
