In response to the above referenced order, Public Works Commissioner Ralph Dunphy reports the following:

Public Works is in the process of developing and coordinating with other Departments an informational pamphlet on the Best Management Practices (BMP's) for Stormwater Management. Information on pervious and impervious surfaces in an urban environment is to be included in the pamphlet. The pamphlet should be available this September.

A Stormwater Management Plan for the City of Cambridge is being developed by Public Works. This plan will have significant impact on stormwater runoff in Cambridge. A report on the activities will be ready for the City Council's Health and Environment Committee in September. Public Works will coordinate the report with other Departments.
