

Cambridge, May 1. 1872.

To the Honorable, the City Council,
of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned respectfully pray represent that the Trustees of the Broadway Baptist Church, have caused the sidewalk in front of the Church property on Bowdoin Street, to be paved with brick, in the belief that said Street was a public Street, as the Allester School House stood upon said Street, and Scaffolds and gutters were laid through the Street.

They now learn that said Street has never been accepted. Wherefore they pray that said Street may be accepted from Harvard Street to Broadway and that the expense of paving said sidewalk may be borne by the City, as in the case of an accepted Street.
