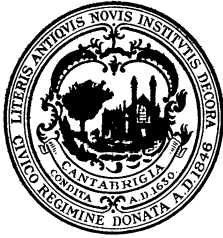

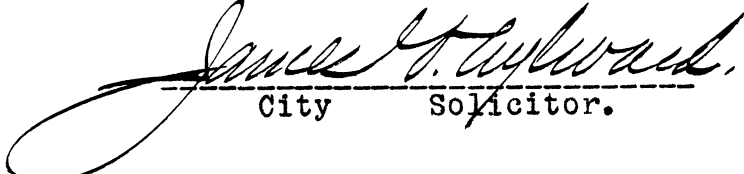
To the Honorable the Board of Aldermen
of the City of Cambridge.

Gentlemen:-

A communication addressed to your board by John Egan of 16 Brattle Street, was at the last meeting referred to the City Solicitor. The communication was in reference to the use of the hall in the Brattle Square Building. It seems that on June 8th 1912 an order was adopted "that his Honor the Mayor was authorized to grant a permit to John Egan and others, constituting the Gaelic School in Cambridge for the use of the Brattle Square Building one evening a week when the same is not otherwise in use. A lease of these premises was made on January 1, 1912 for the term of one year to Post 56, G. A. R. By this lease, the City Council places it out of its power to grant any use of the premises or any part thereof to any one else during that period.

It seems therefore that notwithstanding the order that Mr. Egan's only opportunity to obtain the use of this hall is with the said lessees.

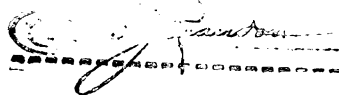
