To the Honorable, the City Council:

On March 6th, I directed Mr. James Farrell, Executive Director of the Model Cities Administration to prepare a comprehensive status-report for the City regarding impending Federal budget cuts and the impact of such cuts on all Cambridge service providers who are dependent (wholly or partially) on Federal, State, local or private funding sources.

The report was to be prepared in two parts, the first of which is herein submitted for your consideration. Part One contains the results of a survey of all Cambridge social service agencies and briefly describes, statistically and narratively, the probable effects of budgeting changes upon service delivery for each of the agencies. In addition, Part One provides, for your information, an index of programs in Cambridge, what services they offer, their client populations, and their budgets.

Part Two, which is currently being developed, will describe the effects of budgeting changes on the major federally-funded agencies in Cambridge (the Redevelopment Authority, the Housing Authority, the Model Cities Agency, and the Cambridge Economic Opportunity Committee), the universities, the private housing market, and the foundations.

I expect that you will find these reports useful in the ensuing months as the City prepares for the advent of Special Revenue Sharing.

Because of interest you have expressed in these reports, I have provided you with an advance copy, with a more formal edition to be provided later this week.
